

MBTA Communities Non-Compliance Grants ineligibility

By statute, compliance is a prerequisite to receive MassWorks and HousingWorks Grants, as well as EOHLC Housing Choice grants.

Municipalities that are compliant with MBTA Communities will have a strong competitive advantage in all the capital programs offered by the Executive Office of Housing and Livable Communities (EOHLC), as well as other grants that are a part of the Community One Stop for Growth consolidated grant programs:

- Community Planning Grants, EOHLC
- Massachusetts Downtown Initiative, EOED
- Urban Agenda, EOED
- Rural and Small Town Development Fund, EOED
- Brownfields Redevelopment Fund, MassDevelopment
- Site Readiness Program, MassDevelopment
- Underutilized Properties Program, MassDevelopment
- Collaborative Workspace Program, MassDevelopment
- Real Estate Services Technical Assistance, MassDevelopment
- Commonwealth Places Programs, MassDevelopment
- As described in the Guidelines, the following grants that are not part of the Community One-Stop for Growth consolidated grant process will also take non-compliance into consideration:
- Land Use Planning Grants, EOEEA,

MBTA Communities Grant upcoming requests

- These are state discretionary grants affected by the MBTA Communities that the Town has received and is currently pursuing.
- Boston MPO funding Grant was used for the intersection improvements to Pleasant Street at Village, Vine, and Cross Streets in FY21 – Totaling \$672,750
- The MassWorks Program Community One Stop Grant - this will be the first time the Town is pursuing MassWorks.
- If the Town votes not to comply, reduced grant funding and costly litigation during a very budgetary challenging time. (The Town of Milton was sued by the State Attorney General two weeks after they voted No.)

BOSTON MPO FUNDING GRANT (TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM "TIP")

- Reconstruction of the Village Street Bridge
- Projected Project Cost \$2,000,000 \$11,000,000

COMMUNITY ONE STOP FOR GROWTH (MASSWORKS INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM)

• Water Main Replacement Atlantic Ave Projected cost \$3,000,000
