WHAT IF MY CAR GETS TOWED

DURING A SNOW EMERGENCY?

WHO DO I CALL? If your vehicle is towed during a snow emergency you should call the Marblehead Police Department's non-emergency phone line at (781) 631-1212 to confirm the

WHERE IS MY CAR? Towed vehicles will be stored at the Town's appound lot located at the transfer station, 5 Woodfin Temace

HOW DO I GET MY CAR BACK? Vehicles will be released only to registered owners. Owners will need to possess proof of ownership, proof of insurance, a valid driver's license, and proof that the fine has been paid in order to claim the vehicle. Bill's Auto Clinic, the Town's towing contractor, should be contacted at (978) 745-2087 to make arrangements to release the vehicle. If the vehicle is not claimed after a 72 hour period the vehicle will be towed to Bill's Auto Clinic at 2 Commercial Street in Salem.

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST? Town Meeting approved an increase in the snow emergency violation ticket to \$100. If your vehicle is towed, you will also be charged a towing charge of \$108 for the tow, a storage charge of \$35 per day, and a mileage charge if the vehicle requires a tow to Bil's Auto Clinic Tow Yard.



Any vehicles parked on-street during a declared snow emergency will be subject to ticketing and towing.



DON'T GET TOWED THIS WINTER!

On a one-year trial basis, the Town of Marblehead is implementing a snow emergency response to snow storm events on an as-needed basis.

When a snow emergency is declared you must remove your vehicle from the street starting at midnight the day of the storm. On-street parking will be allowed the following morning starting at 7am during a declared snow emergency unless conditions do not allow it.

If the duration of any snow emergency is more than a day, on-street parking will be prohibited on each day of the snow emergency from midnight to 7am.




